

Keith W. Servis, Director, NYS Office of Professional Medical Conduct (OPMC), and Deputy Director, Office of Primary Care & Health Systems Management (OPCHSM), New York State Department of Health (NYSDOH)

Keith Servis has held leadership positions in New York State government for over 33 years, developing policy and managing programs in patient safety, health care finance, quality measurement and improvement, health system oversight, and compliance enforcement.

Among Mr. Servis' accomplishments are:

- Director of the NYS Task Force on Clinical Guidelines and Medical Technology Assessment, which developed recommendations for a quality outcomes monitoring program in New York;
- Director of the NYS Task Force on Health Care Quality Improvement and Information Systems, which developed a framework for making provider performance information publicly available;
- Director of the NYS Office of Rural Health, implementing the Critical Access Hospital Program and refining rural health network development to maximize access to health care resources in rural communities; and
- Deputy Director of the NYS Office of Science, Technology, & Academic Research (NYSTAR), overseeing the investment of more than \$150 million in New York's university-based research in high technology sectors such as biotechnology, bioinformatics and genetics, environmental systems, & nanotechnology.

Since February 2007, Mr. Servis has led New York's Medical Board physician discipline program as Director of the NYS Office of Professional Medical Conduct (OPMC). In February 2014, Mr. Servis also was appointed Deputy Director of the Office of Primary Care and Health Systems Management. The OPCHSM is responsible for health system planning and transformation, health care provider licensing and surveillance, health system emergency preparedness and response, health care workforce support, medical conduct, and narcotic abuse and diversion prevention and enforcement. Its jurisdiction includes hospitals, clinics, ambulatory surgery centers, nursing homes, home care agencies, adult care facilities, assisted living programs, emergency medical service providers, funeral firms, physicians, and controlled substance prescribers.

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
